

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2007 ENROLLMENTS IN
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

Summary: This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2007 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. The report also summarizes 12-month headcount enrollments and enrollments in remedial/developmental courses during the 2005-2006 academic year.

Fall 2007 preliminary headcount enrollments at 209 degree-granting institutions total 815,677, while preliminary FTE enrollments total 594,091. Excluding enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois, preliminary headcount enrollments total 807,503, an increase of 0.3 percent from fall 2006, and preliminary FTE enrollments total 588,059, an increase of 1.7 percent from fall 2006.

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2007 ENROLLMENTS IN
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2007 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. It also includes 12-month unduplicated headcount enrollments and information on enrollments in remedial/developmental courses for academic year 2005-2006. Final fall-term headcount enrollments, aggregated by student characteristics such as gender, racial/ethnic group, class level, and declared major, are obtained during the winter and are published each spring in the *Data Book on Illinois Higher Education*. Fall-term enrollments provide a “snapshot” of Illinois higher education enrollments on the 10th day of the fall term. Twelve-month unduplicated headcount enrollments report the number of individuals who attend colleges and universities over the course of the full year.

Preliminary Fall 2007 Enrollments By Sector

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2007 preliminary headcount enrollments at 209 degree-granting institutions total 815,677 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, preliminary headcount enrollments total 807,503, representing an increase of 0.3 percent from fall 2006. Headcount enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown below in Table 1.

Public universities reported a preliminary headcount enrollment decrease of 662 (0.3 percent) between fall 2006 and 2007, while public community colleges reported a headcount decrease of 2,909 (0.8 percent). Independent institutions (excluding out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois) reported a headcount increase of 6,164 (2.5 percent). Institutions in the independent sector are subdivided into two general categories in the attached detailed report of institutional enrollments (Table 8): not-for-profit and for-profit. Not-for-profit institutions reported a headcount enrollment increase of 2,489 (1.2 percent), while the proprietary institutions reported an increase of 3,675 (10.2 percent).

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2007 full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments total 594,091 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, fall 2007 FTE enrollments total 588,059, an increase of 9,774 (1.7 percent) over fall 2006. Undergraduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing the number of undergraduate credit hours by 15; graduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing graduate credit hours by 12. FTE enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown in Table 2.

Public universities reported a preliminary FTE enrollment increase of 694 (0.4 percent), while community colleges reported an increase of 888 (0.5 percent). Independent institutions reported a net increase of 8,192 (4.0 percent) in FTE enrollments. Within the independent sector, not-for-profit institutions reported an increase of 4,539 (2.5 percent) in FTE enrollments, while proprietary institutions reported an increase of 3,653 (15.3 percent).

Preliminary Fall 2007 Enrollments By Level

Table 3 reports fall 2007 preliminary headcount enrollments by level, showing undergraduate headcount at 666,835 and graduate headcount at 140,668. Total undergraduate enrollment grew by 0.1 percent in fall 2007 while total graduate enrollment grew by 1.4 percent. Not included in Table 3 are undergraduate headcount enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois totaling 6,025 and graduate headcount enrollments totaling 2,149.

Table 4 presents fall 2007 preliminary FTE enrollments by level, showing undergraduate FTE enrollments at 485,087 and graduate FTE enrollments at 102,972. Total undergraduate FTE grew 1.4 percent in fall 2007, while total graduate FTE grew by 3.1 percent. Not included in Table 4 are undergraduate FTE enrollments totaling 4,541 and graduate FTE enrollments totaling 1,491 at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois.

Ratio of FTE Enrollment to Headcount

The ratio of FTE enrollment to headcount enrollment is a measure of the proportion of students that are enrolled full time. As illustrated in the table below, this ratio increased slightly in fall 2007 for all three sectors.

Total 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount

Twelve-month unduplicated headcount includes all students enrolled for credit from July 1 to June 30 of the following year (or from September 1 to August 31 of the following year). Total Illinois enrollment in the 2005-2006 academic year, the most recent for which information is available, was 1,233,415, a 0.4 percent decrease over the number served in 2005. A breakdown by sector shows there were 233,859 students attending public universities; 316,933 at independent institutions; and 682,623 at community colleges.

Table 6 illustrates the number of students enrolled in Illinois colleges and universities over a 12-month period for academic years 2002 through 2006. Data are unduplicated, they do not count the same person twice if he or she attended the same college and university in both the fall and spring terms. A person may be counted two or more times, however, if he or she attended more than one institution or campus during the same year.

Comparing twelve-month 2005-2006 enrollment to fall 2005 enrollment, an additional 434,241 individuals across all sectors enrolled during the spring 2006 or summer 2006 terms but not in the fall 2005 term. Students enrolled at community colleges accounted for 75.9 percent of this total incremental difference (329,799).

A significant number of Illinois community college students also enroll in non-credit courses. According to data collected by the Illinois Community College Board, in academic year 2005-2006, Illinois community colleges served 254,280 unduplicated, non-credit headcount students. When combined with credit-course enrollments, total community college system enrollment was 936,903 students in 2005-2006. Data on non-credit course enrollments are not available for public universities or independent institutions.

**Total Remedial/Developmental Students
Within 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount**

The following table summarizes unduplicated headcount of students enrolled in at least one remedial/developmental course during a 12-month period (academic year 2005-2006). Many students simultaneously enroll in college-level coursework and one or more remedial/developmental courses. Such students are included in these data. Detailed remedial/development course enrollment data are presented in Table 9.
