

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2009 ENROLLMENTS IN  
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

**Submitted for:** Information.

**Summary:** This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2009 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. The report also summarizes 12-month headcount enrollments and enrollments in remedial/developmental courses during the 2007-2008 academic year.

Fall 2009 preliminary headcount enrollments at 214 degree-granting institutions total 901,841, while preliminary FTE enrollments total 656,814. Excluding enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois, preliminary headcount enrollments total 892,905, an increase of 3.9 percent from fall 2008, and preliminary FTE enrollments total 650,064, an increase of 4.6 percent from fall 2008.

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2009 ENROLLMENTS IN  
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2009 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. It also includes 12-month unduplicated headcount enrollments and information on enrollments in remedial/developmental courses for academic year 2007-2008. Final fall-term headcount enrollments, aggregated by student characteristics such as gender, racial/ethnic group, class level, and declared major, are obtained during the winter and are published each spring in the *Data Book on Illinois Higher Education*. Fall-term enrollments provide a “snapshot” of Illinois higher education enrollments on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the fall term. Twelve-month unduplicated headcount enrollments report the number of individuals who attend colleges and universities over the course of the full year.

**Preliminary Fall 2009 Enrollments By Sector**

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2009 preliminary headcount enrollments at 214 degree-granting institutions total 901,841 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, preliminary headcount enrollments total 892,905, representing an increase of 3.9 percent from fall 2008. Headcount enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown in Table 1.

\* Out-of-state institutions are excluded from independent institutions. Out-of-state institutions' preliminary headcount was 8,936. American InterContinental University Online, which is an exclusively online institution and was classified as an out-of-state institution prior to fall 2008, accounts for 23,686 headcount enrollments at independent institutions in fall 2009.

Public universities reported a preliminary headcount enrollment increase of 2,342 (1.2 percent) between fall 2008 and 2009, while public community colleges reported a headcount increase of 22,868 (6.4 percent). Independent institutions (excluding out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois) reported a headcount increase of 7,950 (2.6 percent). Institutions in the independent sector are subdivided into two general categories in the attached detailed report of institutional enrollments (Table 8): not-for-profit and for-profit. Not-for-profit institutions reported a headcount enrollment increase of 6,875 (3.1 percent), while the proprietary institutions reported an increased of 1,075 (1.4 percent).

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2009 full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments total 656,814 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, fall 2009 FTE enrollments total 650,064, an increase of 28,592 (4.6 percent) over fall 2008. Undergraduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing the number of undergraduate credit hours by 15; graduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing graduate credit hours by 12. FTE enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown in Table 2.

\* Out-of-state institutions are excluded from Independent Institutions. Out-of-state institutions preliminary FTE was 6,750. American InterContinental University Online, which is an exclusively online institution and was classified as an out-of-state institution prior to fall 2008, accounts for 21,837 FTE enrollments at independent institutions in fall 2009.

Public universities reported a preliminary FTE enrollment increase of 2,079 (1.2 percent), while community colleges reported an increase of 20,502 (10.1 percent). Independent institutions reported a net increase of 6,011 (2.5 percent) in FTE enrollments. Within the independent sector, not-for-profit institutions reported an increase of 1,613 (0.8 percent) in FTE enrollments, while proprietary institutions reported an increase of 4,398 (9.3 percent).

### Preliminary Fall 2009 Enrollments By Level

Table 3 reports fall 2009 preliminary headcount enrollments by level, showing undergraduate headcount at 737,417 and graduate headcount at 155,488. Total undergraduate enrollment grew by 4.1 percent in fall 2009 while total graduate enrollment grew by 2.7 percent. Not included in Table 3 are undergraduate headcount enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois totaling 7,146 and graduate headcount enrollments totaling 1,790.

Table 4 presents fall 2009 preliminary FTE enrollments by level, showing undergraduate FTE enrollments at 536,828 and graduate FTE enrollments at 113,236. Total undergraduate FTE grew 4.6 percent in fall 2009, while total graduate FTE grew by 4.4 percent. Not included in Table 4 are undergraduate FTE enrollments totaling 5,414 and graduate FTE enrollments totaling 1,336 at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois.

### Ratio of FTE Enrollment to Headcount

The ratio of FTE enrollment to headcount enrollment is a measure of the proportion of students who are enrolled full time. As illustrated in the table below, this ratio increased slightly in fall 2009.

### Total 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount

Twelve-month unduplicated headcount includes all students enrolled for credit from July 1 to June 30 of the following year (or from September 1 to August 31 of the following year). Total Illinois enrollment in the 2007-2008 academic year, the most recent for which information is available, was 1,286,408, a 0.2 percent decrease over the number served in 2007. A breakdown by sector shows there were 233,395 students attending public universities; 370,406 at independent institutions; and 682,607 at community colleges.

Table 6 illustrates the number of students enrolled in Illinois colleges and universities over a 12-month period for academic years 2004 through 2008. Data are unduplicated, they do not count the same person twice if he or she attended the same college and university in both the fall and spring terms. A person may be counted two or more times, however, if he or she attended more than one institution or campus during the same year.

Comparing twelve-month 2007-2008 enrollment to fall 2007 enrollment, an additional 471,830 individuals across all sectors enrolled during the spring 2008 or summer 2008 terms but not in the fall 2007 term. Students enrolled at community colleges accounted for 71.1 percent of this total incremental difference (335,330).

A significant number of Illinois community college students also enroll in non-credit courses. According to data collected by the Illinois Community College Board, in academic year 2007-2008, Illinois community colleges served 251,033 unduplicated, non-credit headcount students. When combined with credit-course enrollments, total community college system enrollment was 933,640 students in 2007-2008. Data on non-credit course enrollments are not available for public universities or independent institutions.

### **Total Remedial/Developmental Students Within 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount**

Table 7 summarizes unduplicated headcount of undergraduate students enrolled in at least one remedial/developmental course during a 12-month period (academic year 2007-2008). Many students simultaneously enroll in college-level coursework and one or more remedial/developmental courses and are included in this data. Detailed remedial/development course enrollment data are presented in Table 9.
