

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2010 ENROLLMENTS IN
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

Submitted for: Information.

Summary: This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2010 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. The report also summarizes 12-month headcount enrollments and enrollments in remedial/developmental courses during the 2008-2009 academic year.

Fall 2010 preliminary headcount enrollments at 204 degree-granting institutions total 911,739, while preliminary FTE enrollments total 668,245. Excluding enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois, preliminary headcount enrollments total 897,274, a decrease of 0.5 percent from fall 2009, and preliminary FTE enrollments total 658,337, an increase of 1.7 percent from fall 2009. Five institutions with a combined headcount of 3,777 changed from in-state to out-of-state, a factor in the 0.5 percent decrease. Data were not submitted by nine institutions.

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2010 ENROLLMENTS IN
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2010 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. It also includes 12-month unduplicated headcount enrollments and information on enrollments in remedial/developmental courses for academic year 2008-2009. Final fall-term headcount enrollments, aggregated by student characteristics such as gender, racial/ethnic group, class level, and declared major, are obtained during the winter and are published each spring in the *Data Book on Illinois Higher Education*. Fall-term enrollments provide a “snapshot” of Illinois higher education enrollments on the 10th day of the fall term. Twelve-month unduplicated headcount enrollments report the number of individuals who attend colleges and universities over the course of the full year.

Preliminary Fall 2010 Enrollments By Sector

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2010 preliminary headcount enrollments at 204 degree-granting institutions total 911,739 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, preliminary headcount enrollments total 897,274, representing a decrease of 0.5 percent from fall 2009. Headcount enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown below in Table 1.

* Out-of-state institutions are excluded from Independent Institutions. Out-of-state institutions preliminary headcount was 14,465. Five institutions classified as in-state in 2009 are now out-of-state.

Public universities reported a preliminary headcount enrollment increase of 104 (0.1 percent) between fall 2009 and 2010, while public community colleges reported a headcount decrease of 5,382 (1.4 percent). Independent institutions (excluding out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois) reported a headcount increase of 650 (0.2 percent). Institutions in the independent sector are subdivided into two general categories in the attached detailed report of institutional enrollments (Table 8): not-for-profit and for-profit. Not-for-profit institutions reported a headcount enrollment decrease of 814 (0.4 percent), while the proprietary institutions reported an increase of 1,464 (1.8 percent).

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2010 full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments total 668,245 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, fall 2010 FTE enrollments total 658,337, an increase of 10,817 (1.7 percent) over fall 2009. Undergraduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing the number of undergraduate credit hours by 15; graduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing graduate credit hours by 12. FTE enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown in Table 2.

* Out-of-state institutions are excluded from Independent Institutions. Out-of-state institutions preliminary FTE was 9,908. Five institutions classified as in-state in 2009 are now out-of-state.

Public universities reported a preliminary FTE enrollment increase of 870 (0.5 percent), while community colleges reported an increase of 1,450 (0.6 percent). Independent institutions reported a net increase of 8,497 (3.5 percent) in FTE enrollments. Within the independent sector, not-for-profit institutions reported an increase of 514 (0.3 percent) in FTE enrollments, while proprietary institutions reported a decrease of 9,011 (18.4 percent).

Preliminary Fall 2010 Enrollments By Level

Table 3 reports fall 2010 preliminary headcount enrollments by level, showing undergraduate headcount at 742,318 and graduate headcount at 154,956. Total undergraduate enrollment fell by 0.5 percent in fall 2010 while total graduate enrollment fell by 0.4 percent. Not included in Table 3 are undergraduate headcount enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois totaling 10,949 and graduate headcount enrollments totaling 3,516.

Table 4 presents fall 2010 preliminary FTE enrollments by level, showing undergraduate FTE enrollments at 545,503 and graduate FTE enrollments at 112,834. Total undergraduate FTE grew 1.9 percent in fall 2010, while total graduate FTE grew by 0.5 percent. Not included in Table 4 are undergraduate FTE enrollments totaling 7,845 and graduate FTE enrollments totaling 2,063 at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois.

Ratio of FTE Enrollment to Headcount

The ratio of FTE enrollment to headcount enrollment is a measure of the proportion of students that are enrolled full time. As illustrated in the table below, this ratio increased slightly in fall 2010.

Total 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount

Twelve-month unduplicated headcount includes all students enrolled for credit from July 1 to June 30 of the following year (or from September 1 to August 31 of the following year). Total Illinois enrollment in the 2008-2009 academic year, the most recent for which information is available, was 1,331,085, a 4.1 percent increase over the number served in 2008. A breakdown by sector shows there were 232,569 students attending public universities; 400,150 at independent institutions; and 698,366 at community colleges.

Table 6 illustrates the number of students enrolled in Illinois colleges and universities over a 12-month period for academic years 2005 through 2009. Data are unduplicated, they do not count the same person twice if he or she attended the same college and university in both the fall and spring terms. A person may be counted two or more times, however, if he or she attended more than one institution or campus during the same year.

Comparing twelve-month 2008-2009 enrollment to fall 2008 enrollment, an additional 474,787 individuals across all sectors enrolled during the spring 2009 or summer 2009 terms but not in the fall 2008 term. Students enrolled at community colleges accounted for 71.9 percent of this total incremental difference (341,209).

A significant number of Illinois community college students also enroll in non-credit courses. According to data collected by the Illinois Community College Board, in academic year 2008-2009, Illinois community colleges served 254,324 unduplicated, non-credit headcount students. When combined with credit-course enrollments, total community college system enrollment was 952,690 students in 2008-2009. Data on non-credit course enrollments are not available for public universities or independent institutions.

Total Remedial/Developmental Students Within 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount

Table 7 summarizes unduplicated headcount of undergraduate students enrolled in at least one remedial/developmental course during a 12-month period (academic year 2008-2009). Many students simultaneously enroll in college-level coursework and one or more remedial/developmental courses and are included in this data. Detailed remedial/development course enrollment data are presented in Table 9.
