[Task Force to consider final Public Agenda](#)

The Task Force to create a Public Agenda for College and Career Success will hold its final meeting November 21 at Robert Morris College in Chicago to consider a final draft of the blueprint to guide higher education for the next decade. The Public Agenda planning process, which was directed by legislative resolution, has included 6 formal task force meetings as well as informal working group meetings, 34 regional forums at community colleges throughout the state, and 6 public hearings at public universities. After approval of the Public Agenda by the Task Force, it will be considered by the Board of Higher Education at its December meeting at National-Louis University in Chicago.

civic and business leaders to launch Illinois' participation in the America Diploma Project (ADP) November 7<sup>th</sup> in Bloomington. Illinois recently became the 34<sup>th</sup> state to join the America Diploma Project Network. In these states, governors, state education leaders at all levels, and business executives are working together to raise high school standards, strengthen assessments and curriculum, and align expectations with the demands of college and careers. Illinois' core alignment team will take part in an alignment institute in Washington D.C. on November 23-24. Curriculum teams in Math and English Language Arts will soon begin developing recommendations for aligning Illinois high school graduation standards with career and college readiness standards.

### **Dual Credit Task Force readies final report**

The Dual Credit Task Force held its third and final meeting November 12 in Springfield. Under the leadership of Representative Roger Eddy, the Task Force discussed a draft final report that contained three goals – ensure quality; improve access, equity, and attainment; and increase accountability – and several recommendations to achieve those goals. The Board is directed to submit the Task Force's final report to the General Assembly by December 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **Illinois State hosts summit on accountability**

Illinois State University (ISU) and the Illinois Association of Deans of Public Colleges of Education are hosting a Summit: "Building a Meaningful Educational Accountability System," on November 17. Illinois colleges of education, along with the Illinois State Board of Education and the Illinois Board of Higher Education are invited to participate in the session which will be held at the ISU Alumni Center, Normal. Arthur Levine will join the summit, and also will be giving a public presentation at 7:00 pm on November 18 at the Alumni Center.

### **Administration Offers Financial Assistance to Nurses Working in Veterans' Homes**

Governor Rod R. Blagojevich recently reminded nurses throughout the state that financial assistance is available to help them pay off student loans if they work at Illinois Veterans' Homes. Through the Illinois Veterans' Home Nurse Loan Repayment Program, nurses who provide care for Illinois Veterans in the state's Veterans' Homes are eligible to have as much as \$5,000 of their student loans repaid by the state for up to four years. A total of \$1.22 million in grants is available for nurses this fiscal year.

### **Learn about the Illinois High School to College Success Report**

Regional meetings are being held around the state to inform secondary and postsecondary educators about the Illinois High School to College Success Report, and the pilot scheduled to begin in 2009. Eastern Illinois University officials recently announced plans to move forward with construction of a Renewable Energy Center on the east side of campus. In addition to the power plant, an audit examined electrical upgrades, upgrades to the university's electrical grid

connection and possibilities for wind energy generation. As a result, Eastern is also planning to construct a small wind farm -- composed of three 1.5 megawatt General Electric wind turbines -- somewhere near the Charleston community.
