#### Condition of education in the United States

On May 23, the Department's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), part of the Institute of Education Sciences (IES), released "The Condition of Education 2013," a Congressionally mandated report to the Country on education in America today. The report presents 42 indicators grouped under four areas: population characteristics, participation in education, elementary and secondary education, and postsecondary education. The report also spotlights some areas of interest: trends in employment rates by educational attainment, kindergarten entry status (on-time, delayed-entry, and repeating kindergartners), the status of rural education, and financing higher education.

## General Assembly goes down to the wire on budget decisions for next fiscal year


Returning to Springfield on Sunday afternoon, and working on Memorial Day, the General Assembly will take up the fiscal year 2014 budget. Adjournment of the Spring Session is scheduled for Friday, May 31. The House Appropriations Committee for higher education is scheduled to meet at 9:00 a.m., on Tuesday, May 28. The assumption is that by that time an agreement has been reached, probably including both the House and the Senate.

While behind the scenes efforts continue in the development of the General Assembly's proposed budget for fiscal year 2014, both the House and Senate have been considering bills passed in the other body, as well as motions of concurrence, and are sending bills to the Governor for his consideration and signature.

#### A sampling of commencement announcements for Illinois colleges and universities



Dr. Harry Berman, Executive Director of the Illinois Board of Higher Education, delivered the commencement address at <u>Waubonsee Community College's 45th annual commencement</u> on May 23. He talked to graduates about the importance of not only having dreams, but also the drive to reach them. The Class of 2013 is Waubonsee's largest ever, with 1,128 graduates.

- Governors State University will award bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees to approximately 1,500 graduates at its June 8 <u>Commencement</u>. GSU will host morning and afternoon ceremonies at the Tinley Park Convention Center. GSU is awarding an honorary doctorate to Maria Hinojosa, an award-winning journalist for some of the Nation's most respected news organizations. Hinojosa will speak at the 10 a.m. ceremony.
- ❖ The Northern Illinois University College of Law will present former Illinois Gov. James R. ## Though enrolling more poor students, 2-year colleges get less of federal pie (The New York Times)

WASHINGTON — Community colleges have received a declining share of government spending on higher education over the last decade, even as their student bodies have become poorer and more heavily African-American and Latino, according to a report released.

Although the Affordable Care Act is intended to increase access to health insurance, a growing number of community colleges have been moving in the opposite direction by cutting adjuncts' hours and, consequently, their eligibility for coverage. But one college is bucking the trend in part, offering insurance to a limited number of non-tenure-track faculty.
