

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2012 ENROLLMENTS IN
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

Submitted for: Information.

Summary: This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2012 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. The report also summarizes 12-month headcount enrollments and enrollments in remedial/developmental courses during the 2010-2011 academic year.

Fall 2012 preliminary headcount enrollments at 219 degree-granting institutions total 863,542, while preliminary FTE enrollments total 636,435. Excluding enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois, preliminary headcount enrollments total 846,710, a decrease of 2.3 percent from fall 2011, and preliminary FTE enrollments total 625,415, a decrease of 3.6 percent from fall 2011.

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2012 ENROLLMENTS IN
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2012 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. It also includes 12-month unduplicated headcount enrollments and information on enrollments in remedial/developmental courses for academic year 2010-2011. Final fall-term headcount enrollments, aggregated by student characteristics such as gender, racial/ethnic group, class level, and declared major, are obtained during the winter and are published each spring in the *Data Book on Illinois Higher Education*. Fall-term enrollments provide a “snapshot” of Illinois higher education enrollments on the 10th day of the fall term. Twelve-month unduplicated headcount enrollments report the number of individuals who attend colleges and universities over the course of the full year.

Preliminary Fall 2012 Enrollments By Sector

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2012 preliminary headcount enrollments at 219 degree-granting institutions total 863,542 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, preliminary headcount enrollments total 846,710, representing a decrease of 2.3 percent from fall 2011. Headcount enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown below in Table 1.

Public universities reported a preliminary headcount enrollment decrease of 5,271 (2.6 percent) between fall 2011 and 2012, while public community colleges reported a headcount decrease of 14,272 (3.8 percent). Independent institutions (excluding out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois) reported a headcount decrease of 793 (0.3 percent). Institutions in the independent sector are subdivided into two general categories in the attached detailed report of institutional enrollments (Table 8): not-for-profit and for-profit. Not-for-profit institutions reported a headcount enrollment increase of 2,364 (1.1 percent), while the proprietary institutions reported a decrease of 2,055 (2.8 percent).

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2012 full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments total 636,435 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, fall 2012 FTE enrollments total 625,415, a decrease of 23,057 (3.6 percent) over fall 2011. Undergraduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing the number of undergraduate credit hours by 15; graduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing graduate credit hours by 12. FTE enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown in Table 2.

Public universities reported a preliminary FTE enrollment decrease of 3,900 (2.2 percent), while community colleges reported a decrease of 9,340 (4.3 percent). Independent institutions reported a net decrease of 9,817 (3.9 percent) in FTE enrollments. Within the independent sector, not-for-profit institutions reported a decrease of 4,297 (2.2 percent) in FTE enrollments, while proprietary institutions reported a decrease of 5,520 (9.8 percent).

Preliminary Fall 2012 Enrollments By Level

Table 3 reports fall 2012 preliminary headcount enrollments by level, showing undergraduate headcount at 698,566 and graduate headcount at 148,144. Total undergraduate enrollment declined by 2.6 percent in fall 2012 while total graduate enrollment declined by 1.3 percent. Not included in Table 3 are undergraduate headcount enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois totaling 9,570 and graduate headcount enrollments totaling 7,262.

Table 4 presents fall 2012 preliminary FTE enrollments by level, showing undergraduate FTE enrollments at 515,199 and graduate FTE enrollments at 110,216. Total undergraduate FTE declined 4.1 percent in fall 2012, while total graduate FTE declined by 1.1 percent. Not included in Table 4 are undergraduate FTE enrollments totaling 6,878 and graduate FTE enrollments totaling 4,142 at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois.

Ratio of FTE Enrollment to Headcount

The ratio of FTE enrollment to headcount enrollment is a measure of the proportion of students that are enrolled full time. As illustrated in the table below, this ratio decreased in fall 2012.

Total 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount

Twelve-month unduplicated headcount includes all students enrolled for credit from July 1 to June 30 of the following year (or from September 1 to August 31 of the following year). Total Illinois enrollment in the 2010-2011 academic year, the most recent for which information is available, was 1,350,134, a 1.7 percent decrease over the number served in 2010. A breakdown by sector shows there were 234,270 students attending public universities; 399,067 at independent institutions; and 716,797 at community colleges.

Table 6 illustrates the number of students enrolled in Illinois colleges and universities over a 12-month period for academic years 2007 through 2011. Data are unduplicated, they do not count the same person twice if he or she attended the same college and university in both the fall and spring terms. A person may be counted two or more times, however, if he or she attended more than one institution or campus during the same year.

Comparing twelve-month 2010-2011 enrollment to fall 2010 enrollment, an additional 445,832 individuals across all sectors enrolled during the spring 2011 or summer 2011 terms but not in the fall 2010 term. Students enrolled at community colleges accounted for 75.6 percent of this total incremental difference (337,061).

A significant number of Illinois community college students also enroll in non-credit courses. According to data collected by the Illinois Community College Board, in academic year 2010-2011, Illinois community colleges served 233,002 unduplicated, non-credit headcount students. When combined with credit-course enrollments, total community college system enrollment was 949,799 students in 2010-2011. Data on non-credit course enrollments are not available for public universities or independent institutions.

**Total Remedial/Developmental Students
Within 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount**

Table 7 summarizes unduplicated headcount of undergraduate students enrolled in at least one remedial/developmental course during a 12-month period (academic year 2010-2011). Many students simultaneously enroll in college-level coursework and one or more remedial/developmental courses and are included in this data. Detailed remedial/development course enrollment data are presented in Table 9.
